Miss Kinga Lakatos, a Hungarian volunteer stayed at Aruna Bhawan for three weeks and was given a farewell on 24th of July 2019. Aruna Bhawan thanked her for her contribution to the children. The staff and volunteers of Aruna Bhawan made a solemn promise to plant at least five trees each, reduce the usage of plastic and recycle the resources to show their care and concern towards safeguarding the mother earth. Moreover, they have decided to campaign for the same in their schools. Aruna

Bhawan has started tuition classes for the neighborhood children. There are about twenty children who regularly come for tuition. Miss Meena Aryal has been admitted at Banepa children's hospital to treat her clubbed feet. Operation has been already done for one leg and needs to stay for at least six months. We are hoping that with the operation of both the legs she may be able to walk freely and independently.

Bipana Shahi from Bardiya who worked in a family and was paid only NPR 3000/- was rescued from there and is admitted at Don Bosco Institute, Thecho for vocational training. Her uncle had brought her to Kathmandu city with a promise of educating her. He had given the girl to a family in NPR 9000/-. Girl's mother couldn't believe when she came to Kathmandu that her daughter is working in the family instead of studying. Therefore, Fr. Dilip suggested that girl be immediately rescued from there, with the help of local police, in case they don't release her. Now she is getting trained as beautician and tailor master. Isha Shrestha, one of the SEE students re-joined Aruna Bhawan to pursue her +2 in management at Tripadma Higher Secondary School, Lalitpur.

Nepal Jesuit Social Institute [Kamal Niwas]

The 27km road that goes nearly 4000 mtrs high through the Himalayas should carry the name of the St. Xavier who literally did network between Europe and Asia bringing God's people together. "Xavier Marg" is also an iconic representation of the motto of NJSI: "Reaching the Unreached."

The local government gave a simple statement permission without much fuss. We had felt that not many would believe the project was going to happen, as the terrain was steep cliff and high altitude with rocks all over. Moreover, the Tyangra pass which had no footrest for an excavator wouldn't be crossed without blasting the rocks, an impossible thing to do with a shoe string budget of 3.5 crores Nepali Rupees while the government estimate showed nothing less than 7 crores for the same work. There were no contractors who would do the work for less than 5 crores. Then it was Fr. Joesph Pulickal of Kolkata Province proposed the idea that we buy the excavator and convinced the management committee that we save taxes and avoid the daily rent amount of the machine even when we are not working. The then Region Superior, Fr. Boniface Tigga, SJ after the consult, granted the necessary permission to go ahead with purchasing the JCB 220LC excavator. We had to face several challenges mainly during the winter season, the place would be covered with snow for at least 3 months, and the landslides during the monsoon.

On 13th July, a handover ceremony of the road was conducted at Tipling itself. The program lasted for one hour. Reverend Bishop Paul Simick, NJS Superior, Fr. Amrit Rai, chairmen of Ruby Valley Rural Municipality ward no.1 and 2 Mr. Min Ghale and Mr. Pemba Gale inaugurated the road officially by cutting the ribbon.



NJSI also conducted a felicitation Program on 20th July at NJSI National office at Kathmandu to honor the real heroes of the road construction. In the program Fr Roy, Director of NJSI presented a short video on the construction of the road. He also shared the experiences, challenges faced during the implementation phase. Fr. Roy honored 9 distinguished people who had contributed immensely: JCB operator Mr. Pradip Basnet, an excavator operator and a mechanic. He received a life time achievement award from NJSI and the JCB representative naming him as the Outstanding JCB 220LC Operator. His helpers Lo Tamang, Falam Tamang and Shiva Subedi, while Man Bahadur Tamang and Kho Bahadur Tamang cleared the sites. Kailash Thapa and Dipendra Tamang were the transport coordinators who became the first drivers of Xavier Marg.

The function was graced by the presence of Bishop Paul Simick, Former Local Development Officer (LDO) of Dhadhing, Bhagone Aryal. Vice chairman of Ruby Valley Rurla municipality, Beena Ghale, Chairman of Ruby Valley Rural Municipality ward no.1, Min Ghale, and Manager of MAW Earth Movers Pvt.Ltd (JCB), Yam Gurung and finally the whole religious communities in Kathmandu valley and the well-wishers of NJSI.

Amrit and Juel visited two of our mission stations namely Majat and Lapdung in the afternoon. He also had private meeting with parishioners soon after the holy Eucharist and with community in the evening. Fr. Ayar returned with them to Kathmandu and made his annual retreat at Godavari under the guidance of Fr. Bill. He will go to Matigarha, India for pastoral counseling workshop before returning to Tipling.

Jesuit community is looking for a plot of land which is available for a small but permanent chap-

el in Lapdung. Fathers have been saying mass in a private house there until now. As "ecumenical" requiem mass and cremation were held for Tika Ghale baptized two year ago as an adult, the mass was held in Lapdung and cremation was in Majat where he was born. Nima Lama was baptized with the approval of her non-catholic family. She had requested for baptism several times previously before lapsing into coma. Fr. Mike baptized her as she was in danger of dying.

Six of our Plus 2 Tipling girls have joined computer course conducted by the NJSI at Kamal Niwas in Kathmandu. A paralegal and annual retreat for parishioners are planned next in the schedule. It will be held in Tipling with retreat experts and legal experts who will be coming from Kathmandu.

The road to Tipling is completed and the dozer is now at home beside the SJ residence in Tipling until its future is decided.

Desideri House

If the old saying “No news is good news” is true, then things have been going well in Boudha. It has been a quiet, steady month. This is apart from the daily challenge of dealing with the open sewers and horrible road conditions -- which are more or less the same as they were a year ago, despite our protests and promises. It must be one of the only places in Nepal where you need a mask for the dust & gum boots for the mud at the same time.

The summer intensive program at the KU Centre for Buddhist Studies brings a large number of graduate students from around the world to study Sanskrit, Nepali or Tibetan at an advanced level. Because many of these graduate students are in the field of ethnography and anthropology, I spend a lot of time meeting with them to advise them on research. The surge of interest in Newar Studies, in particular, means a steady flow of traffic through Desideri House. In July I taught an intensive mini-course on “The Buddhism of the Kathmandu Valley” that was well-received. This

was preceded by an on-site lecture at Swayambhu, and followed by an extensive tour of religious sites in Patan.

Our main visitors this month were Professor Christoph Emmrich and his wife, Professor Srilata Raman, from the University of Toronto. KU-CBS is setting up an affiliation with University of Toronto, so their visit was especially welcome. Christoph is an up and coming force in the field of Newar Studies. Though I was meeting him for the first time, Srilata and I realized that we overlapped at Oxford, and even shared a class together. She is a friend of Harvard Professor, and former Nepal regent, Fr Frank Clooney SJ.

Fr Yann Vagneux MEP has been with us throughout the summer session to learn Nepali. Having spent a decade in Varanasi, he is comfortable in Hindi, which allows him to make rapid progress in Nepali class. Having him here has been a blessing.
