GOOD SHEPHERED, TIPLING

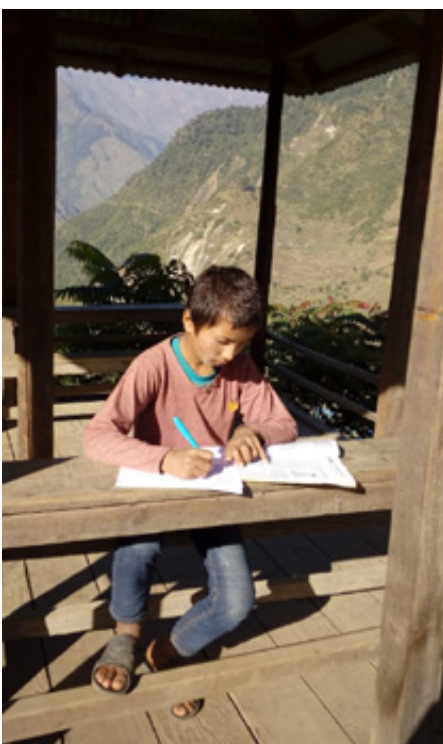

I struggled all the three weeks, but I also learned to understand few words in Italian.

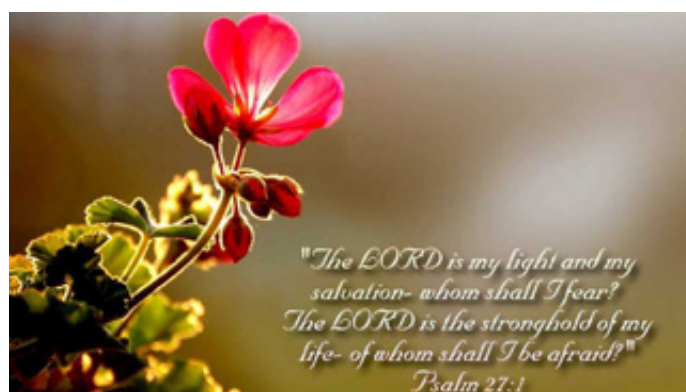
