Meanwhile we have already welcomed the first of four Australian Jesuit-run immersion programs for this season. Fr Alan T. Y. Wong SJ led the first group from the Cardoner Project, from 6-21 December. After a few days of orientation in Boudha, with input talks at Desideri House, and a short volunteer stint with the missionaries of Charity, the Cardoner group headed to Tipling for a week-long school camp and interaction. Sardar Chandra Rai, our very able guide and good friend, led the trek there. Cardoner will send a second group to Ne-

pal in January. Like the first they will spend time in Tipling. Two groups from St Ignatius College Riverview will land in Nepal a few days after Christmas and be with us for about three weeks. Though they arrive and depart on the same flight, and both stay in Boudha while in Kathmandu, the groups follow separate programs during their time with us. That makes for some very creative scheduling during their first few days. Both groups head to schools in western Sindhuli District for a few days' school camp before then going on treks in the Annapurna Region.

Work on a new edition of Fr John Locke SJ's monumental work, Buddhist Monasteries of Nepal, continues. Meanwhile, there is more good news on the publication front. I am now making arrangements to release the second edition of Buddhist Dqily Ritual, my book on Newar devotional practice. Work on my next book, Hilarion of Abtei: The History of the Mission to Tibet, Nepal and Bettiah continues, as time allows.
