Nepal Jesuit Social Institute (NJSI)

Para-legal programs have been organized to empower and educate the women of rural places about their fundamental rights, gender based-violence and sexual and reproductive rights. Para-legal training programs have been conducted in various parts of Dolakha, Sindhupalchowk, Sindhuli and Kavre district from the year 2018. Till now 12 women halls completed and nearly 300 women have benefited from the training programs.



Every year five women centres are targeted for training programs and an advanced training program is organized in NJSI for the women who have already received the basic para- legal training.

While the staff of NJSI organizes and conducts the basic training program, a lawyer is invited to conduct the advance para-legal training program to address the women's issues more properly.

Currently, two programs have already been conducted in Kshyamadevi Women Centre and Dedidevi Women Center. The participants after the program are observed whether they have understood properly their rights, and then directed towards spreading the knowledge in their communities. After the program an abridged book of the Constitution of Nepal was distributed to them free of cost.

Tipling Mission

Both the schools, primary and secondary, celebrated their Annual School Day with songs, dances, and presentations of prizes, with parents and local officials in attendance. Speaking of prizes, our scholarship students did very well in their second term exams, thanks to you generous donors. Among them Karuna in particular has been improving regularly. She is an orphan. She and her siblings have looked after each other from their early age. She is now preparing for her final year of high school.





Our youth and village elders totaling 30 people accompanied Fr. Ayar to Lincho. It is one of our outreach stations. These excursions are normally an all-day affair. Lincho is a young Catholic community and also home to our many high school students who regularly make the daily six hour round trip through the mountains to get to school in rain or shine.

The purchase of land for a prayer house in another of our outreach villages, Lapdung, is moving ahead. We have located a piece of land and a owner is willing to sell.

MOBILE CLINIC KATHMANDU-NUWAKOT



The Baniyatar Mobile Clinic is at full swing. We work in three Districts; Nuwakot, Kathmandu and Dhading.

This month we extended to 5 new clinics in 5 remote villages and 4 clinics in 4 Government schools. Besides regular clinics we conducted

2 health camps in Dhading District, one in a brick factory in Golche, Dhading and another in Dunganagov, Dhading District. Total No of Patients: 500. Brick factory workers have migrated from Terai Districts like Nawalparasi, Kapilvastu, Banke, Bardia, Dang and also from India like Bihar and Uttar Pradash, seeking for jobs. These people are very poor and belongs to low caste ethnic group. Here people are living in small huts along with their family. Many of the children are not educated



due to poverty. We conducted free health checkups and distributed general medicine. We also provided a First Aid box to the owner of the factory.

During these 6 months we treated 16,000 patients in all the clinics.
